Read through the article and answer the questions below.

An "underclass" in Britain

For years both Charles Murray of the American Enterprise Institute and the former editor of The Sunday Times, Neil Andrew, have pointed out the emergence of a new underclass. Murray has warned of a range of conditions in Britain associated with the growth of a class of violent, unsocialised people who, if they become sufficiently numerous, will fundamentally degrade the life of society'. Murray also mentions the increasing proportion of children born out of wedlock (40%!), the rise of violent crime and a dramatic increase (50%) of young aged between 18 and 24 not in work in the past ten years. For the first time politics in Britain has acknowledged the existence of Britain's underclass and Jack Straw, the home secretary, is about to act. It remains to be seen if anything can be done at all.

You can find a social stratification in every society. In your opinion, how many social classes are there in Austria and how would you name them?

What do you think are the reasons for the emergence of the new underclass in Britain?

Think about strategies to create places of work. What would you do first? What incidents can lead to being poor and unemployed?

Education is very important for one's future. In Britain the annual fees for private schools that provide excellent education are mostly extraordinarily high. And in most African countries children have to pay tuition fees from the first grade on.

What do you think about "Free access to education for everybody"? If nobody had to pay for schools and universities - would the situation in Britain be different?
